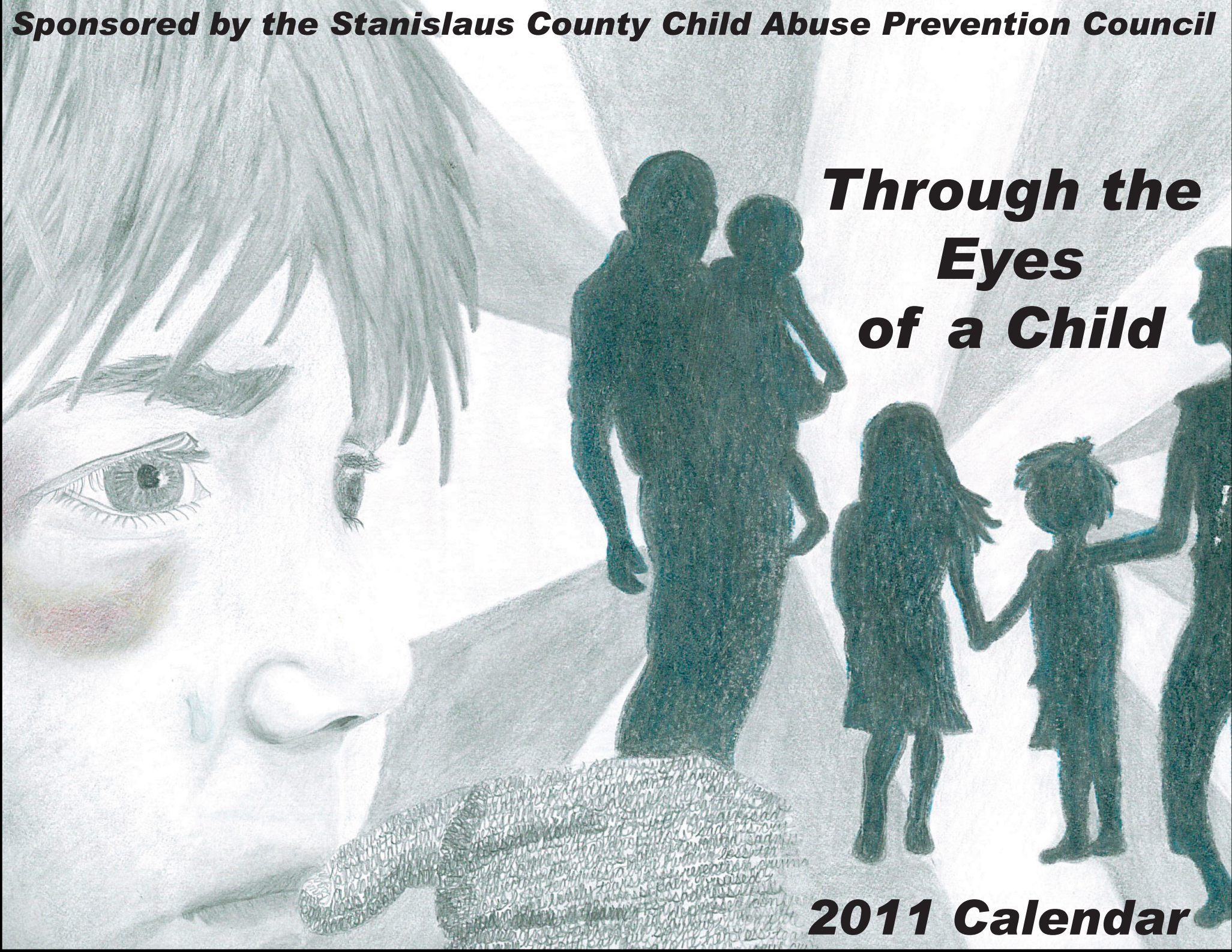

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, trained call center operators are standing by to help those most in need.

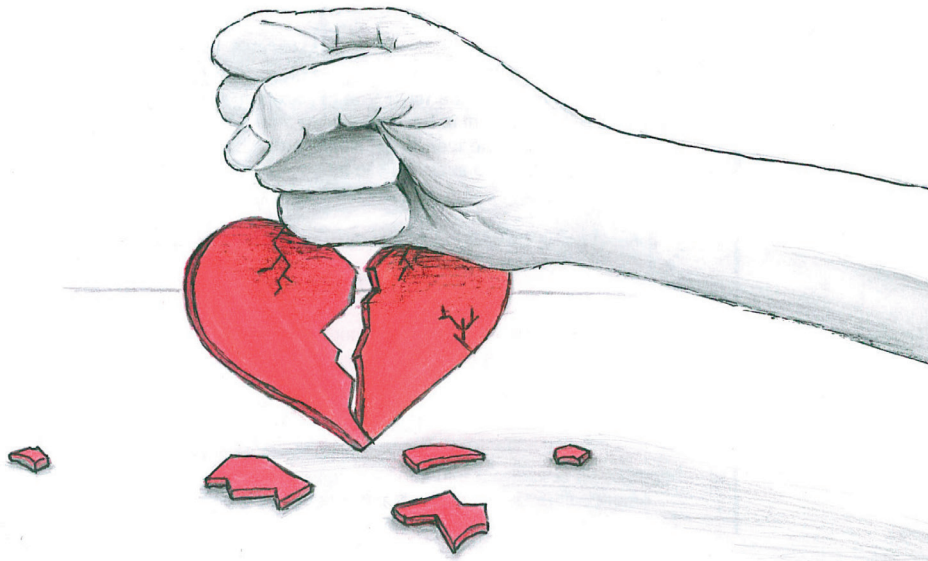

Never Shake a Baby!

Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS) is a severe form of head injury caused by violently shaking an infant or child. Tragically, one third of babies identified as suffering from SBS die and one third suffer severe lifetime disabilities.

As a way of addressing this serious form of child abuse, the Child Abuse Prevention Council developed and implemented the Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention Program.

This primarily hospital-based program is delivered in partnership with all Stanislaus County birthing hospitals (Doctors Medical Center, Emanuel Medical Center, Memorial Medical Center, Oak Valley Hospital, Kaiser Permanente) and includes the following:

- 1) Parents are shown a training video that provides education on SBS and demonstrates effective ways to respond to an infant's crying.
- 2) Hospital staff reviews the key components of SBS and infant crying with the parents.
- 3) Parents then sign a "commitment statement" never to shake their baby and to pass this mandate on to all other adults that will care for their baby.

Our SBS program is modeled after a successful New York State model and will eventually educate all new parents of the more than 8,000 children born in Stanislaus County each year. When fully implemented the SBS program has shown a 40-50% reduction in SBS cases. Funding for this program is provided by the Stanislaus County Children and Families Commission.



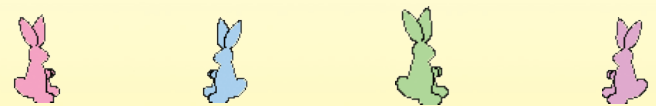

April is "Child Abuse Awareness Month"

In 1998, the Child Welfare League of America launched a public awareness campaign to direct attention to violent child deaths as part of a sustained national initiative to reduce child mortality.

Many agencies in and around Stanislaus County fly the Children's Memorial Flag during the last week of April. The flag is flown to commemorate children lost to violence. The flag also serves to remind each one of us that we can make a big difference in the life of a child. Call any agency listed in this calendar and find out how you can help.



STANISLAUS FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER

The Stanislaus Family Justice Center (SFJC) offers victims and survivors of domestic violence, child abuse, elder/dependent adult abuse and sexual assault a path to safety and hope through compassion and coordinated services. Opened in October, 2010, the SFJC allows for service providers to be housed under one roof to provide services to victims, eliminating the need for victims to travel from agency to agency. Our vision is to break the cycle of violence.

On-site partners at the SFJC include Haven Women's Center, CAIRE Center, Community Services Agency, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, District Attorney, Sheriff's Office and Chaplaincy Services. We also have off-site partners including law enforcement, Adult Protective Services, Memorial Medical Center, TANF, and Probation.

The SFJC is client-focused with staff on site to welcome each person who walks through the door.

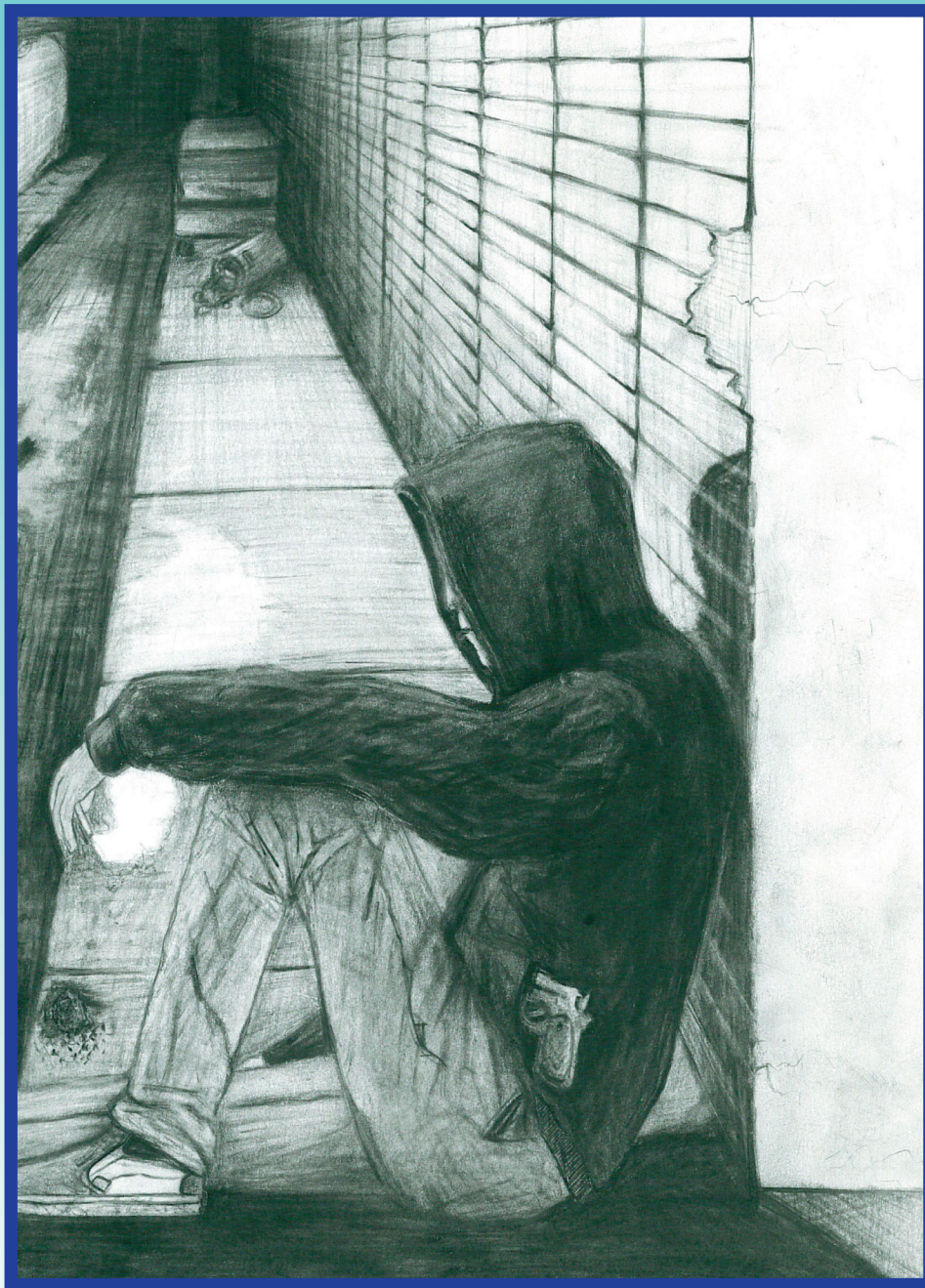

FAMILY AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES

- ❖ Parent Education Classes — for parents, caregivers, teachers, and others who care for children to enhance their ability to deal with challenging children.
- ❖ Adult Treatment Services — provides treatment in the areas of Domestic Violence, Anger Management, Child Abuse, and counseling for High Risk families.
- ❖ First Step Perinatal Substance Abuse Treatment Program — A drug and alcohol treatment program for pregnant, post partum, and parenting women.
- ❖ Children's Counseling — Providing mental health services to families with children ages 6-18 experiencing emotional and behavioral difficulties.
- ❖ ADHD Services — Provides services for children ages 2-18 that have a primary diagnosis of Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder.
- ❖ Early Intervention — This program provides comprehensive child and family counseling services to families with children 0-5 years of age.
- ❖ Non-Public Schools — Sierra Vista's three non-public schools provide special education for emotionally disturbed children K-8th grade.
- ❖ Public School Based Services — Provides on-school site counseling services to students who have emotional disturbance.
- ❖ Home Based Services — An intensive, in-home clinical program focused on reducing the risk of out of placement and psychiatric hospitalization of youth.
- ❖ Foster Care Services — Program matches children requiring supported, specialized foster care with loving, stable foster families. Intensive Treatment Foster Care, Adoption, and Residential Treatment are also provided.
- ❖ Family Resource Centers — North Modesto, Drop In Center, BRIDGE, and partnering with Hughson Family Resource Center.

Foster Care: Aspiranet provides Stanislaus County with foster care and Intensive Treatment Foster Care.

Adoption: We believe when reunification is not possible, every child has the right to a permanent family that can provide safety and well-being. Aspiranet has invested in the dual preparation of families for foster care certification and adoption to better meet the permanency needs of children and our county partners.

ProFamily Reunification Program: Aspiranet works with biological parents who have had their children removed from their care and are failing their reunification plan.

Transitional Housing Program (THP-Plus): Aspiranet provides THP-Plus services for emancipated foster youth. The THP-Plus program assists former foster youth in becoming independent, focusing on education, employment, and independent living skills.

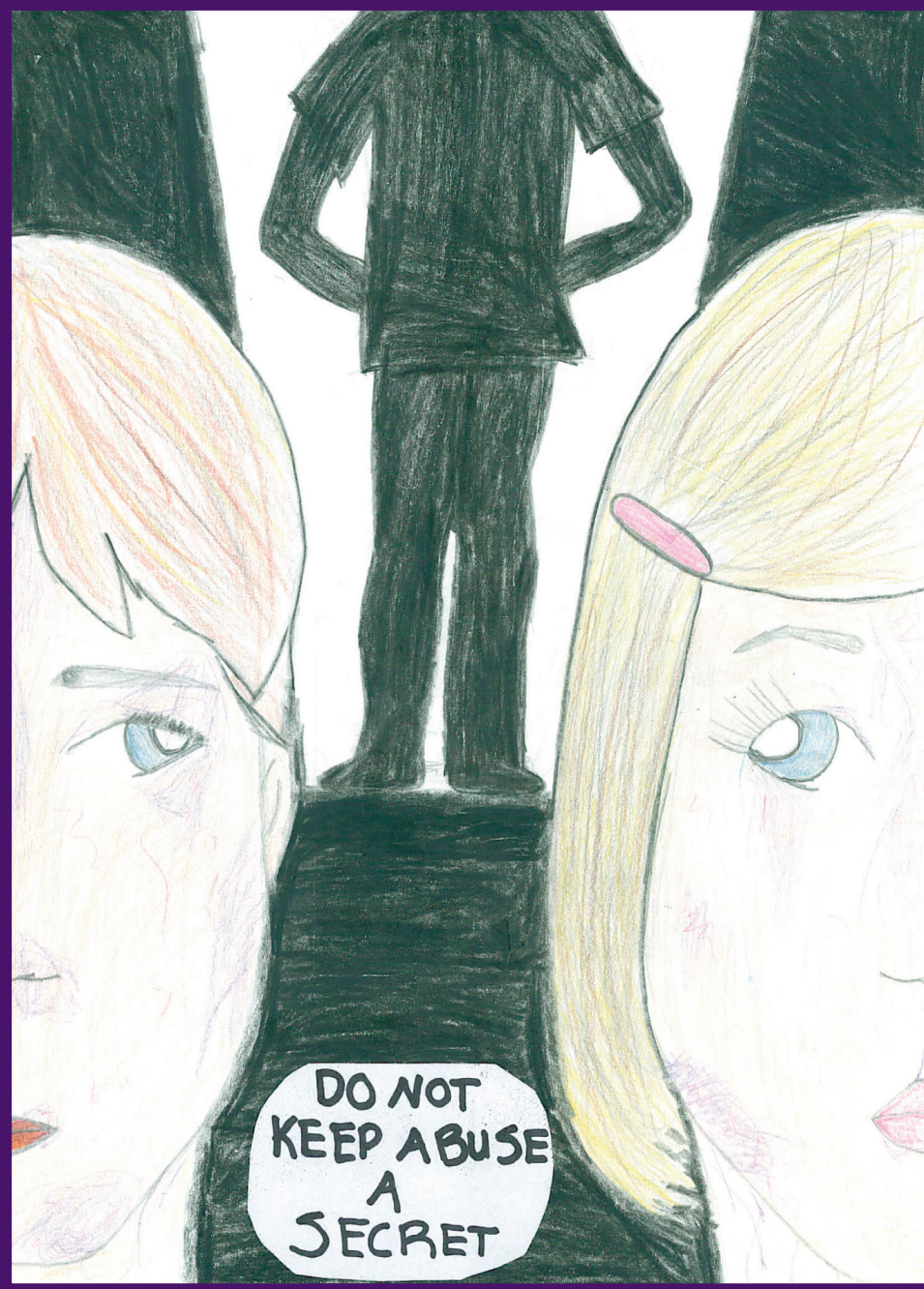

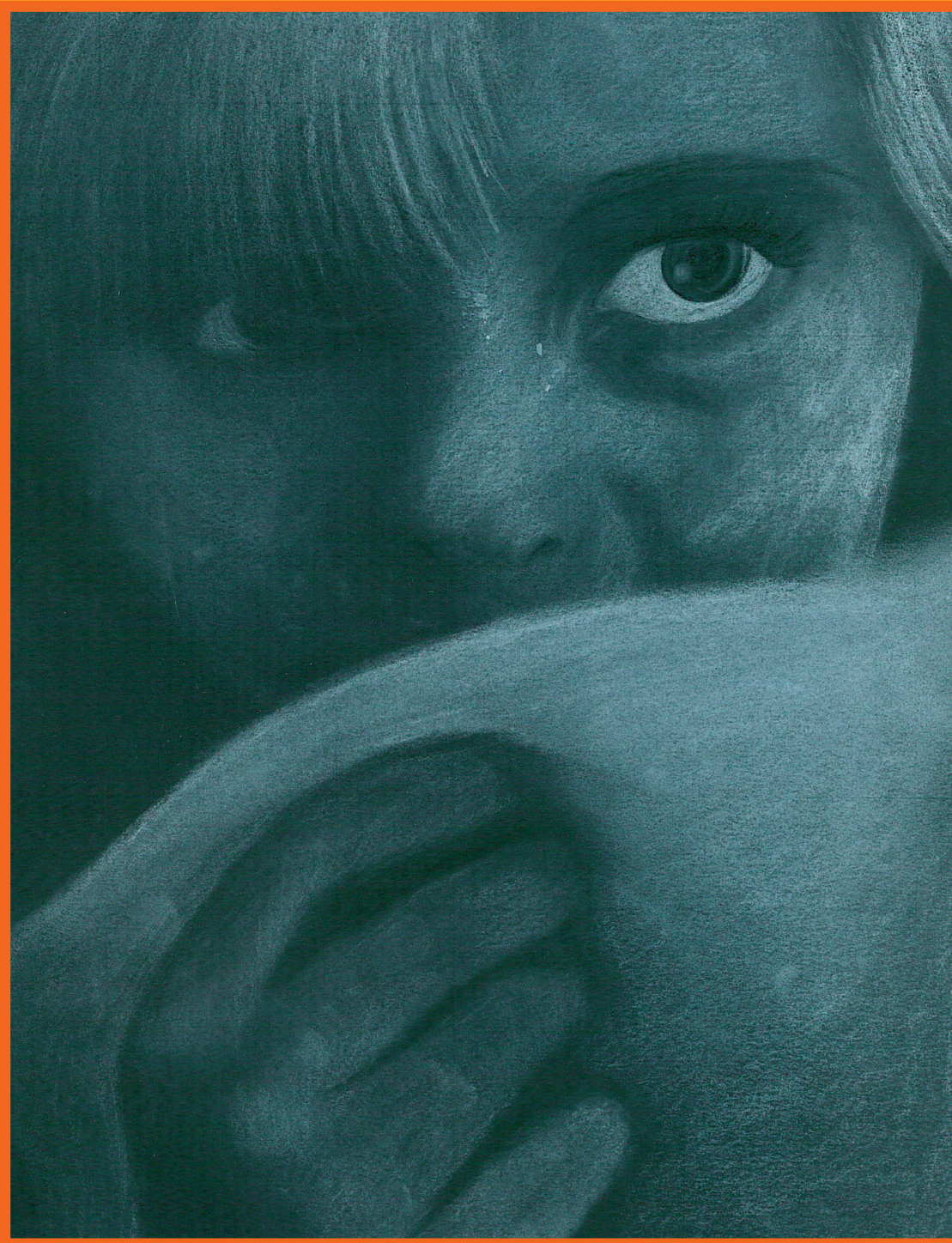

Behavioral Health and Recovery Services Children's System of Care (CSOC)

The CSOC provides behavioral health services for children, adolescents, and families in Stanislaus County. These services include clinical treatment, drug and alcohol services, individual and group treatment, parent advocate services, case management, psychiatric treatment, recreational services, and transitional youth services.

Services are provided along with our partner agencies, Child and Family Services, Juvenile Probation, Education, and Health Services Agency, as well as with contracted agencies. The goal is to assist families in a holistic, collaborative model.

Children's Crisis Center of Stanislaus County

The Children's Crisis Center (CCC) is a private, nonprofit organization that provides protective child care and emergency shelter to local children at risk. CCC offers free prevention and intervention services to children ages birth to 17 years. Assistance is available from 5 locations throughout Stanislaus County. Service sites are accessible in the cities of Modesto, Turlock, and Oakdale. All service locations are open to provide immediate protection to children living in high risk family situations, and supportive services to parents in crisis.

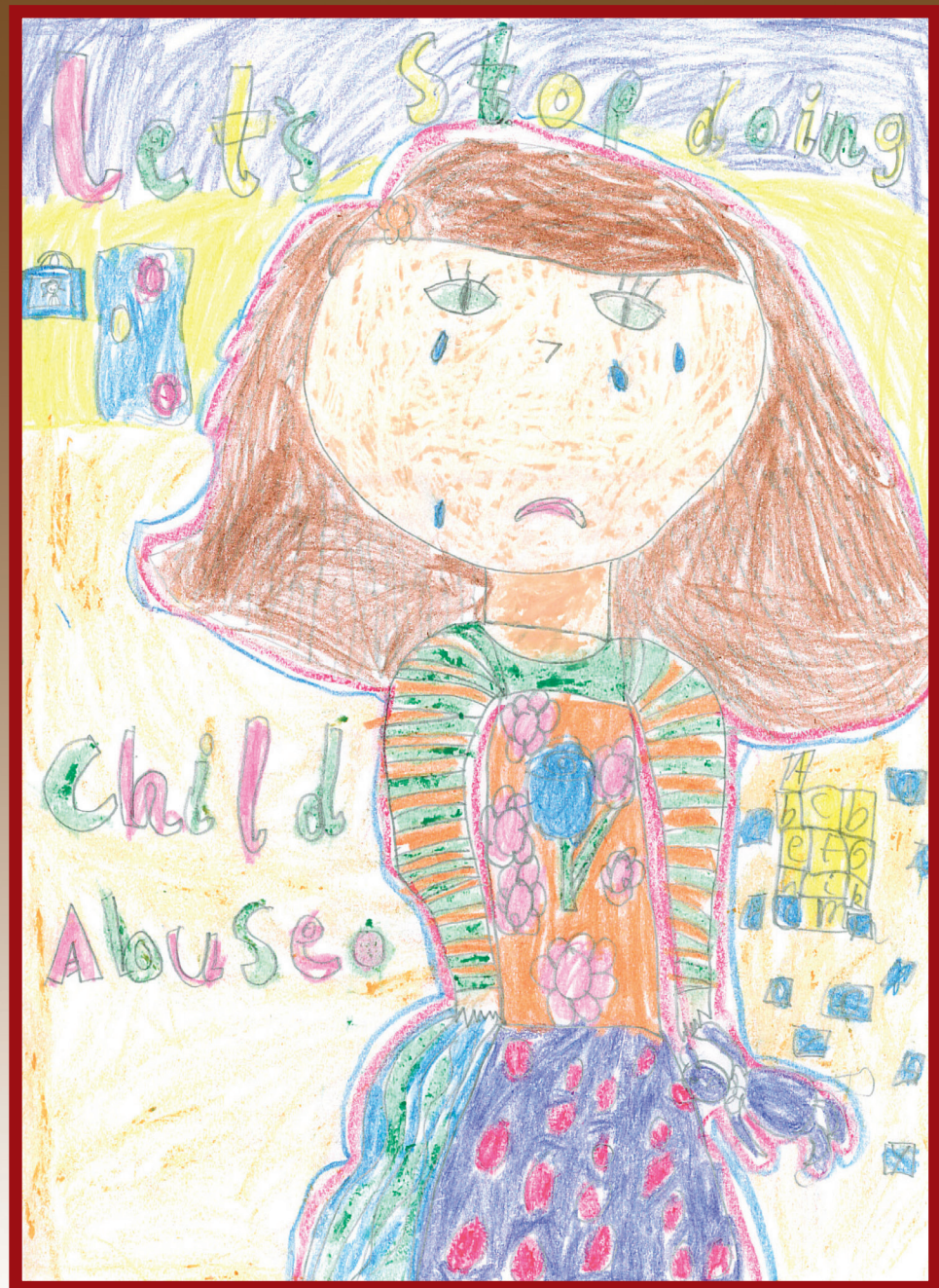
Children receive both daytime and overnight care that includes regular meals, individualized attention, clothing, learning opportunities, and therapeutic play – all essential in promoting their healthy development. As children are safeguarded in a comfortable home setting, parents are assisted by crisis counselors to achieve recovery, crisis resolution, housing needs, and to overcome challenging family circumstances.

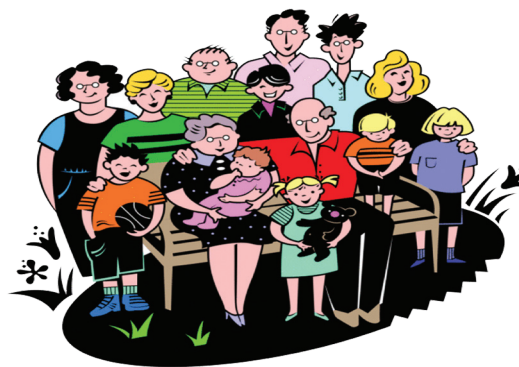
